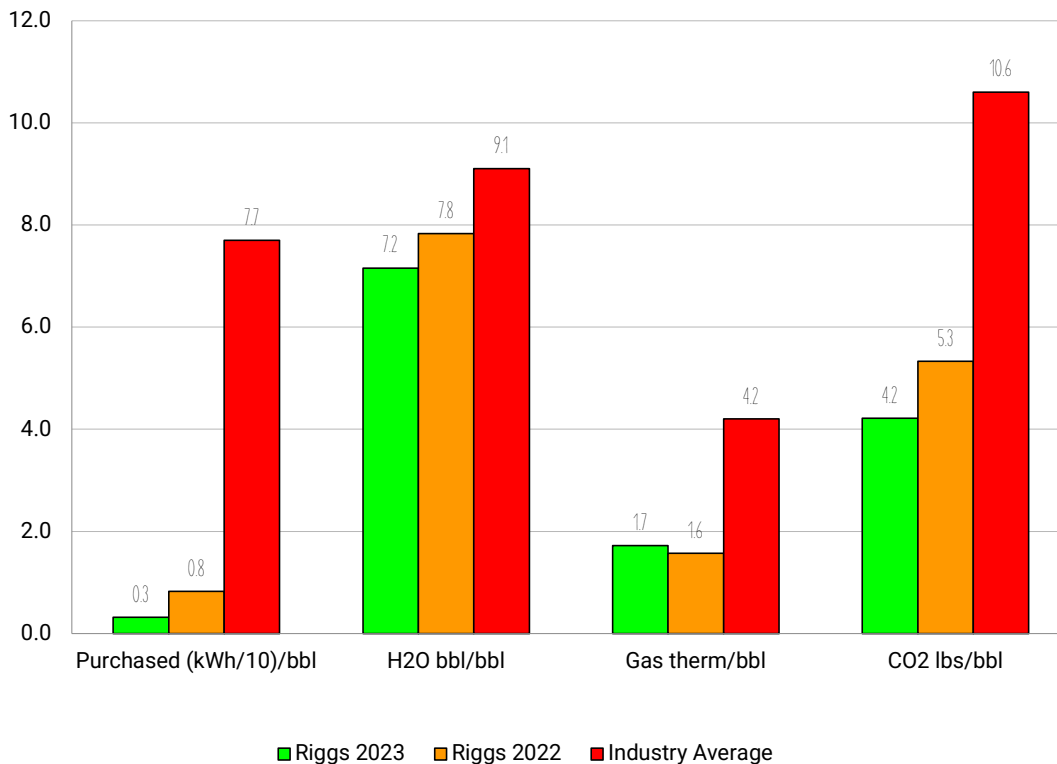

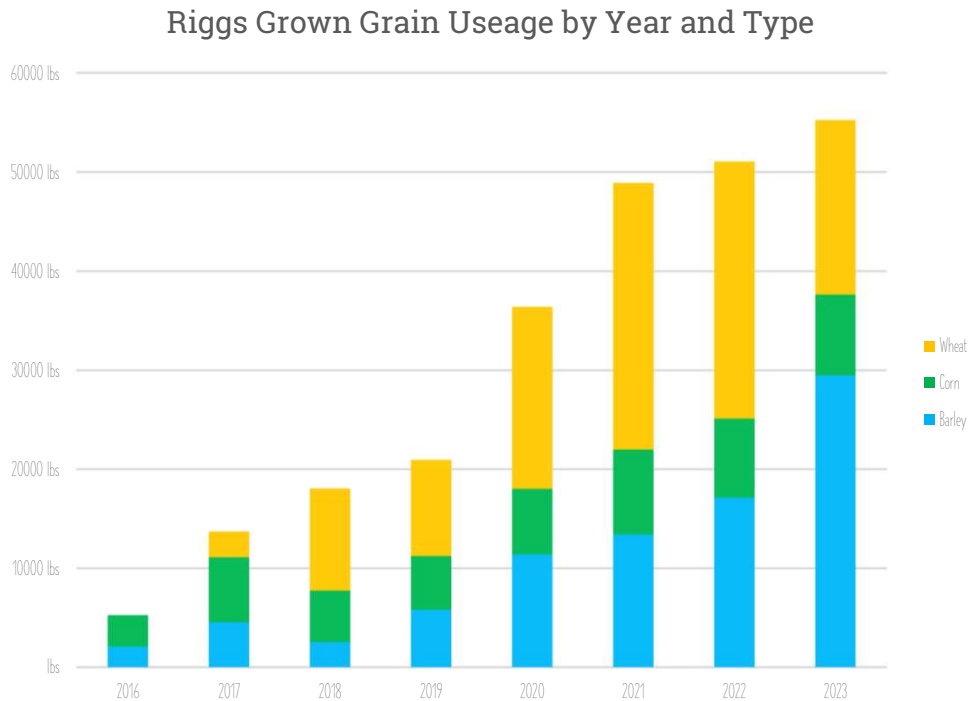
Benchmarking Performance



We designed our brewery with resource efficiency in mind. Each year, we strive to find ways to improve our processes; not just to make better beer, but to do so with as minimal impact on our environment as possible.

Industry averages (mean) were pulled directly from the Brewers Association 2017-2021 Benchmarking Survey for breweries between 1,000 and 10,000 barrels in size. Sixty breweries provided data for this size category in the survey.

Local Grain Usage

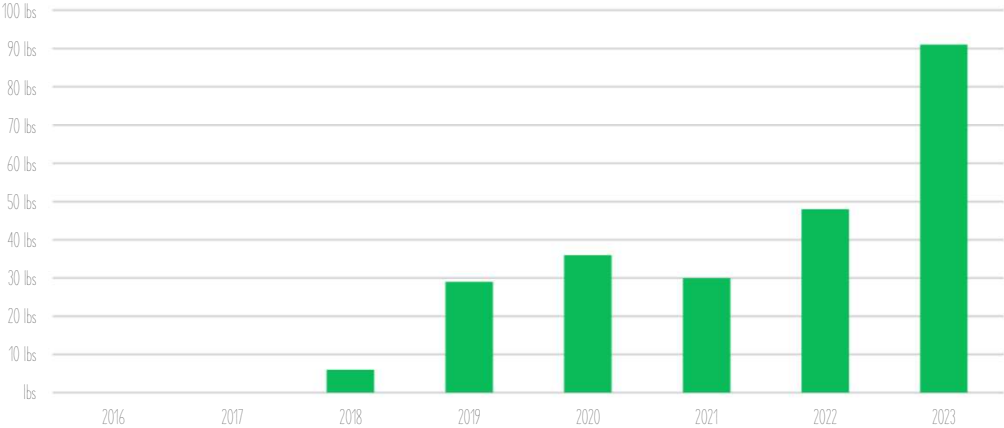


Brewing with grains grown within a few miles of the brewery drastically reduces our beer's carbon footprint. As you can tell from the graph, we're continuing to focus on maximizing our vertical integration of Riggs-grown brewing grains.

We know of no other brewery in the mid section of the US that uses a similar amount of their own, hyper-local grains.

Our support of local agriculture isn't limited to just our own farm. Each year, we purchase hops from Hallowed Hops, just south of Lewistown, IL.

New Sustainability Efforts

- A new solar array expansion is planned for later this year. Once active, it will increase the amount of our on-site solar production to over 100% of our annual demand.
- Starting last year, 100% of the Riggs Farm is now participating in Champaign County Soil and Water Conservation District's S.T.A.R. program.
- A Paktech can carrier reuse drop-off is now located at the entrance to our brewery. We will clean and reuse all undamaged Paktech carriers that are returned to us.
